To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Alexander McKeown of Belmont County, Ohio,
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Steubenville
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Alexander McKeown
 according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the North West quarter of Section Thirty-five in Township Eleven, of Range Seven,
 in the district of lands offered for sale at Steubenville, Ohio, containing one
 hundred and fifty three acres of fifteen hundredths of an acre,
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said Alexander McKeown
NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several
 acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Alexander McKeown
 and *totis his* the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appur-
 tenances, of whatsoever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Alexander McKeown
 and *totis* heirs and assigns forever.

 PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto
 affixed.
